Introduction

Who am I, and why am I teaching natural childbirth? I'm just a mother. Yes, I've had seven children and have experienced hospital births, a birth-center birth, and three home births (two unassisted), as well as an emergency c-section with my last child – but I'm still just a mother. I'm not a doctor. I'm not a midwife. I'm not a nurse.

Yes, I have done a lot of reading about pregnancy and childbirth. You can, too!

Yes, I've researched the various issues that comprise this topic, and I'll show you how to research, too. (Please don't just take my word for things.)

Yes, I've studied so that I feel fairly confident and can remember terms and definitions. To whatever point you feel it's necessary, you can, too.

Yes, I'm even taught the subject of natural pregnancy and childbirth, but this just shows that I get excited when I realize how fun it is to help other moms.

Still, I'm just a mom. I firmly believe that I can become an expert on my own children's births for three reasons:

- I take personal responsibility for my health and for the health of my unborn baby. I don't expect an "expert" to make decisions for me so that I don't have to study and learn. Rather, I welcome counsel and knowledge, realizing that at the end of the day, I must take responsibility for whatever choices I make.
- I can access written knowledge that has been passed on from generation to generation, in the form of books, medical studies and journals, and even the Internet. I don't have to go to medical school or even college to have access to this wealth of knowledge.
- I can tap into the collective, verbal knowledge of women who have given birth before. Since the time of Eve, women have been giving birth... and I suspect that the early mothers loved to talk about it as much as I do! I can learn much from their wisdom.

I have confidence that birth is a normal event in the life of a woman, and it's my goal to pass this confidence on to you. I believe that God sovereignly created our bodies with the capability to bear children. I realize that in 1 to 2 percent of births, emergencies come up that could threaten the life of a mother or her child. But in most cultures, birth is viewed as a normal life event. It is thrilling and life-changing – but not an emergency.

Of course, sometimes I need help. I need support from my husband. I need encouragement from other mothers. I might even encounter situations that exceed my abilities. I'm only human. It's okay to ask for help.

But I also realize that God gave me only nine months in which to prepare for my new baby. This time is finite, and I must not waste it.

And if you're hoping to have a natural pregnancy and a peaceful birth, then you must choose to take responsibility as well.

I hope to be a mother that comes alongside you and supports you. My explanations might be a little unusual. You certainly won't read the same answers as you might in *What to Expect When You're Expecting*. However, I'm hoping to instill confidence, knowledge, and calm into your early mothering efforts.

Am I a little radical? Well, if I depart from what is usual in America, in the birthing community, then I suppose I am. I like the definition of radical that says, "Arising from or going to a root or source; basic." I want to take you back to the basics of childbirth, even to the source of all wisdom, God's Word, and to teach you ways to have a baby confidently.



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Saved Through Childbearing

Let a woman learn in silence with all submission. And I do not permit a woman to teach or to have authority over a man, but to be in silence. For Adam was formed first, then Eve. And Adam was not deceived, but the woman being deceived, fell into transgression. Nevertheless she will be saved in **childbearing** if they continue in faith, love, and holiness, with self-control (1 Timothy 2:11-15).

A Weaker Vessel

As the hide boiled, a thick sticky substance formed at the surface of the water. This substance was removed and used as a binding agent. Ancient Hebrew: The pictograph of represents strength. The is water or any other liquid. Combined these pictographs mean "strong liquid".

(fem., DN / eym) Translation: MOTHER Definition: A female parent. Maternal tenderness or affection. One who fulfills the role of a mother. Relationship to Root: The arm that holds things together. The arm is seen as glue that encircles and holds together. A cubit was the length of the arm from elbow to fingertip. According to the <u>Ancient Hebrew Lexicon</u>, ancient people used to put animal hides in a pot of boiling water, and skim off the thick substance that formed at the surface, to use as glue. Thus the **strong** (*aleph*) **water** (*mem*) is the glue that holds together, as the mother is the glue that holds the family together. By the way, the ancient method of making "strong water" is still the basis of glue production today.

The story the ancient pictographs are telling is of the **strong one** (aleph, i.e., the man) who is **buried in the earth** (nun, as the seed is buried in the earth), **returning** (shin, in the sense of repeating) from whence he came. Man is defined in terms of his mortality.

"In the sweat of your face you shall eat bread, till you return to the ground; for out of it you were taken; for dust you are, and to dust you shall return." Gen 3:19

Birthing Stool

Abstract: Intelligence, Understanding Definition: The tent was constructed of woven goat hair. Over time the sun bleaches and weakens the goat hair necessitating their continual replacement. Each year the women make a new panel, approximately 3 feet wide and the length of the tent. The old panel is removed (being recycled into a wall or floor) and the new strip is added to the tent. Since the tent is only replaced one small piece at a time the tent essentially lasts forever. Ancient Hebrew: The pictograph of is a picture of the tent. The is a picture of a sprouting seed and represents continuity as the seed continues the next generation. The combined meaning of these letters mean "the continuing of the house".

`O' (masc., □ / ben) Translation: SON Definition: A male offspring. This can be the son or a later male descendant of the father. One who continues the family line. Relationship to Root: There are many similarities between building a tent out of goat hair panels and the building of a house out of sons (The idea of building a house with sons can be seen in Genesis 30.3).
