

## Required Texts and Materials:

- Hillsdale College is the premier American University teaching Constitutional theory as the Framers envisioned it. All of their online coursework is free to the general public.
- The supplemental readings are in American history and Western Civilization political philosophy, from which the Framers drew, and are available free of charge on the course pages below.

## How to Use:

To utilize this course of study for each unit:

- Day 1: View the lecture, while taking notes.
- Day 2: Complete the supplemental reading on the second day.
- Go on to the next lecture in the series, allowing two days per each lecture and its supplemental reading.
- When all the lectures and readings have been completed for the unit, then take the final quiz.
- Repeat for each unit.

Completing all eight unit according to the above scheme requires 178 study days, or one school year, for 1 full credit of high school Civics and American history.

# ECONOMICS – INTRODUCTION

We recommend that students do the following reading assignments for economics ***while completing Government coursework***. One day per week should be devoted to reading Economics, ***in addition to*** a student's government assignments. (Some students may prefer to read a smaller portion daily.)

The course concludes with a term paper (details below). We recommend allowing 6-9 weeks to research and write your term paper.
