Review: Nouns and Verbs

Definition: A noun is a person, place, thing, or idea.

Nouns are things that God created.

- A person – God created all people, such as Adam or Eve. Can you name some other people God created?
- A place – God created all places, such as the Garden of Eden or Africa. Can you name some other places God created?
- A thing – God created all things, such as cats, trees, or rocks. Can you name some other things God created?
- An idea – God created all ideas, such as love, joy, and peace. Can you name some other ideas God created?

Things without names are called common nouns. Things with names are called proper nouns. Proper nouns always begin with a capital letter.

Definition: An action verb is a word that shows action.

The following words are always verbs, but they don't show action. We call them "being" verbs.

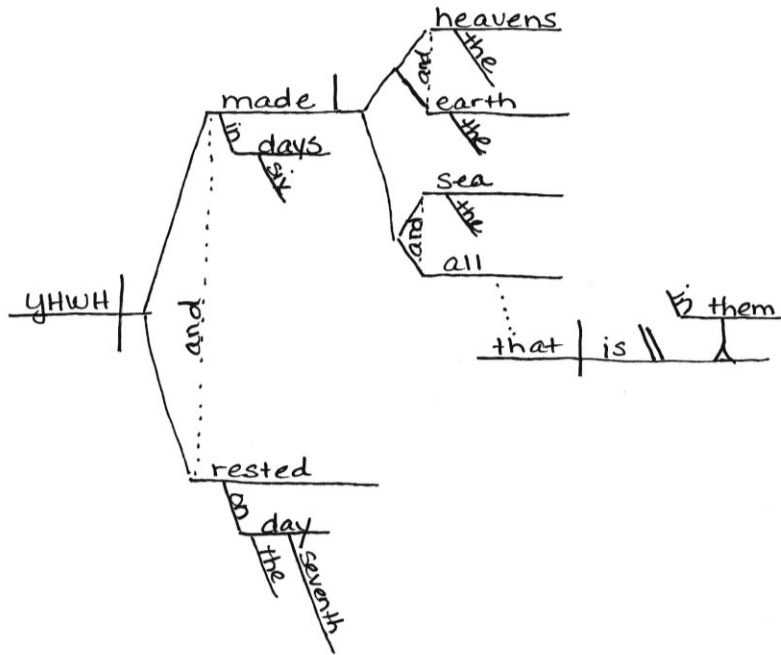

Review: Verb Phrases and Subjects

Definition: A verb phrase is a verb plus its helping verbs.

Helping Verbs

Definition: A Subject is the word that tells who or what the sentence is about. A subject is always a noun.

Nouns can be **subjects** or **objects** (objects of prepositions, direct objects, indirect objects).
